CALLS TO ANIMAL CONTROL: EMERGENCIES VERSUS NON-EMERGENCIES

Emergency Call Outs: Emergencies requiring a possible call out of a Clinton County Animal Control Officer (CCAC) include but are not limited to:

- Confined stray animal with life threatening injury.
- Animal posing an immediate threat or danger to the public.
- Any situation that a Clinton County Sheriff's officer or local Police Department officer deem a necessity and require a CCAC officer to respond.

Not Considered an Emergency Warranting a Call- Out:

- Barking dogs, unless a police officer requires CCAC officer.
- Dead animal unless posing a traffic hazard.
- Unconfined animals running at large.
- Injured animals with owner present. (Owners of injured animals are responsible for the transport of their injured animals to a veterinarian and paying for the bills incurred).
