8. True or False: Candidates and precinct committee persons CAN NOT serve as pollwatchers even if they have pollwatcher credentials.

11. Voters may have their right to vote challenged by

12. If a ballot sheet contains a valid write-in vote, the election judges should:

15. True or False: All ballots in the auxiliary/emergency bin must be processed *after* closing the polls and *before* closing out the tabulator.
16. True or False: Beginning with the number “1” the ballot applications are numbered consecutively and spindled in numerical order.
17. Voters that have requested assistance can be helped by the following individuals:
- a. A friend or relative

18. A registered voter is flagged on your precinct list as needing to show identification prior to voting for the first time on Election Day. If the presented identification verifies the voter’s name and address, the voter will be eligible to vote a ballot that will be tabulated on Election Day. If they do not provide the proper identification, the election judges should:

21. True or False: Before a voter completes an application to vote, the election judges must first determine if the voter has already voted.
22. True or False: An election judge must offer instructions to every voter on the proper way to mark the ballot sheet.
23. If the tabulator in the polling place becomes inoperable for any reason, the election judges should:
- a. Call the election authority and/or designated technical judge

26. True or False: Election judges should pre-initial the ballot sheets before the voters arrive.

27. True or False: Unused, spoiled, and damaged ballots should be disposed of at the polling place. Only voted ballots should be returned to the central counting location.
28. Before the polls open, judges must
